The Canterbury Tales by Geoffrey Chaucer

Choose a tale. Each class must have at least one representation of each tale, so decide quickly to assure your choice! Each set is approximately the same length, so <u>don't ask</u> <u>which is shortest</u>. CHOOSE WISELY.

- ➤ "The Miller" and "The Reeve" (both bawdy tales about cuckolds; each man tries to one-up the other)
- ➤ "The Man of Law" (showing the virtue of Christianity, although it gets rather violent...)
- ➤ "The Wife of Bath" (more about the teller than the tale, the Wife of Bath is a lady of varied experience)
- ➤ "The Cleric" (idealistic view of love and loyalty)
- ➤ "The Merchant" (cynical view of love and loyalty)
- ➤ "The Physician" and "The Pardoner" (both tales involve death, but one is as a result of virtue and one of vice)

Choose a form and represent the tale's important elements—this *includes* any pertinent <u>prologue information</u> as a <u>characterization of the storyteller</u>.

- You may work independently or with a group
- Groups may be formed—*maximum* of 3—and work should represent quality x 3!
- Modern retelling in story, rap, poem, etc.
- Comicbook, scrapbook, or other visual interpretation
- Children's book (cannot be used for Miller/Reeve, Wife of Bath, Merchant)
- If you have another form in mind, please clear it with me

Projects will be graded on creativity, quality, connection to text, and significant and identifiable characterization. Impress me!
